SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION

Telford & Wrekin Council declared a climate emergency in July 2019, committing to its own operations being carbon neutral by 2030, but also with the aspiration that this extended to the borough as a whole. To ensure that groups in the community are supported in this aim, Telford & Wrekin Council established a £100,000 Climate Change Fund for local organisations to apply to for projects which will support these aims.

Lilleshall Parish Council have been successful with their application to the fund.

The grant will help to deliver solar pv panels at the Lilleshall Tennis Centre.

The Tennis club provides Free and Affordable tennis facilities for the use of all members of the community, and this funding will help the club to continue to benefit the community.

This is great news for lilleshall, and supports the parish councils commitment to its aspirations to a carbon neutral future.



FOOTPATH IMPROVEMENTS

Lilleshall Parish council are commited to improving the footpaths in and around Lilleshall. Officers and councillors have surveyed the most popular foot paths and reported those that require maintenance or improvements. The parish are working with Telford & Wrekin Council, to help get these works done as soon as possible.

Whilst we will make every effort to report all works are needed, we are limited to the time that we have to survey the damage. So we are asking the community to keep an eye out for any damage, or work needed to the footpaths and signange and report it to the parish council. Be sure to make notes of location, Google co-ordinates or "what three words" are very helpful tools for this. And take pictures, this way we can ensure the accuracy and urgency of the work needed. Whats happening on The Hill?

TOPOGRAPH DESIGN AND INSTALLATION

Lilleshall Hill has exceptional views of our countryside. Following several requests to the parish council for a topograph, it became a possibility thanks to a donation of £1,500 by the Lilleshall Monumental 10K Run towards the cost of design, manufacture, and installation.

We appointed a local artist and company, who were able to create the artwork and produce an etched image, mounted and ready for framing. Using panoramic photographs of the view, scanned on to a graphics software. The artist was able to create an accurate black and white image of the overall view.

The next stage was to identify and add the names of features making up the landscape, which was achieved with a compass and a bit of O level geometry and geography. Using the O.S. survey station on the hill and the radio mast on the Wrekin as a base line it was possible to establish the bearing to individual landscape features. This made it possible to correlate the hills and features with the artist's draft computer image, to provide the final computer image.

Having produced the image on a computer, the next stage was to produce the completed etched image on a sheet of aluminum. This required the artist to redraw the image by hand onto a wax coated sheet of aluminum which was then immersed in acid to etch the image into the metal. The penultimate stage was to clean off the wax and coat the sheet with black paint, and finally, the paint was cut back using wire wool, and the end product — It's open to view on Lilleshall Hill.

A Story Shared

The Lilleshall Monument is a 70ft obelisk standing on Lilleshall Hill. It is dedicated to the 1st Duke of Sutherland, George Granville Leveson Gower who was a local land owner. After his funeral on 31st July 1833 his "grateful" tenants set up a fund and raised £933.15 for the monument. Originally there were 2 lions and 2 griffins at each corner but after a violent thunderstorm which damaged the monument these were removed. The griffins can be seen on the old A518 at Cheswell drive, and the lions are at the Lilleshall Sports Centre which was the home of the Sutherland family until 1917 when all the property and land was sold to pay death duties.
